- 1) We have audited the accompanying annual Financial Results of SPBP Tea (India) Limited("the Company") for the year ended 31st March, 2018, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 read with SEBI Circular no. CIR/CFD/FAC/62/2016 dated 5th July, 2016. These Financial Results have been prepared on the basis of the Annual Audited Ind-AS Financial Statements and reviewed quarterly financial results upto the end of third quarter which are the responsibility of the Company's management and has been approved by the Board of Directors. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these Financial Results, based on our audit of such Financial Statements, which have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standards (Ind-AS) specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") read with relevant rules made there under and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.
- 2) We conducted our audit in accordance with the auditing standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Financial Results are free from material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts disclosed in the Financial Results. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

## 3) Basis for Qualified Opinion

The Company has not provided liability on account of terminal benefits (gratuity) in accordance with IND AS-19 "Employee Benefits" amounting to Rs.245.61 Lakhs for the year in the financial statement, which constitutes a departure from the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed in section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

Had the Provision been made in the financial statements for the year, the Provision would have been increases by Rs 245.61 Lakhs as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018 and in the current financial year gain of Rs 7.30 lakhs due to actuarial gain, retained earning "under other equity" would have been reduced by Rs 252.89 lakhs.

## 4) Opinion

Subject to above, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these Financial Results:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 in this regard; and
- (ii) givea true and fair view of the net loss, total comprehensive income and other financial information for the year ended 31st March, 2018.
- 5) The statement includes the results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2018 (considered audited) being the derived figures between the audited figures in respect of the current full financial year ended 31st March, 2018 and the published year-to-date figures upto 31st December, 2017, being the date of the end of the 3rd quarter of the current financial year which were reviewed by us.

- \* Consequent to the introduction of GST, inter-state stock transfer of good has become taxable with availability of input tax crdit, the utilisation of which is available in subsequent periods. As a result, movement in Other Current Assets and Other Current Liabilities is not comparable with earlier period.
- The financial results of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) (Amendment) Rules, 2015 as amended by the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) (Amendment) Rules, 2016. The Company adopted Ind AS from 1st April, 2017, and accordingly, the financial results for the quarter endeed 31st March, 2018 (including for all the periods presented in accordance with Ind AS 101 First-time Adoption of Indian Accounting Standards) have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles in Ind AS 34 Interim Financial Reporting, prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the relevant rules issued there under and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- 2) In regard to Tea business the value of consumption of raw materials includes green leaf purchased from the parties and own raw materials. As the production of green leaf (Raw materials consumed by the Company for manufacture of Tea) is also from the Company's own estate and involves integrated process having various stages as nursery, planting, cultivation etc. their values at the intermediate stages could not be ascertained.
- 3) The Company is engaged in the business of cultivation, manufacture and sale of tea which is seasonal in character and due to consignment sale during the first quarter, sales has been recorded based on account sale received so far, hence the foregoing figures should not be construed as being representative of likely results for the year ended 31.03.2018
- 4) Segment Reporting as defined in Indian Accounting Standard-108 is not applicable since the operation of the Company relates to only one segment i.e. "Manufacturing and Sale of Tea".
- 5) The above Audited Financial Results for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2018 were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Company at their respective meetings held on 30th May, 2018. Limited Review of the Audited Financial Results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2018, as required under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 has been carried out by the Statutory Auditors of the Company.
- 6) This Statement is as per Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015

9) Exemptions applied at transition

Ind AS 101 (First-time Adoption of Indian Accounting Standards) provides a suitable starting point for accounting in accordance with Ind AS and is required to be mandatorily followed by first-time adopters. Ind AS 101 allows first-time adopters exemptions from the retrospective application of certain requirements under Ind AS.

The Company has applied the following exemptions in its financial results:-

- i) Property, Plant and Equipment were carried in the Statement of Financial Results prepared under previous GAAP as at 31st March, 2016. The Company has elected to regard such carrying amount as deemed cost at the date of transition i.e. 1st April, 2016.
- ii) Under previous GAAP, Investments were stated at lower of cost and fair value. Under Ind AS, these Instruments are required to be measured at Fair Value, Fair Value Changes with respect to Investments in Equity Instruments have been recognised in FVTOCI Equity Investments as at the date of transition and subsequently in other comprehensive income for the Year ended 31st March, 2017. This has decreased FVTOCI Equity Investments by Rs 15.68 Lakhs as at 31st March, 2017 (1st April, 2016 Rs 19.27 Lakhs)
- 10) Consequent to the introduction of Goods and Services Tax (GST) with effect from 1st July, 2017 Central Excise Duty, Value Added Tax (VAT), etc. have been replaced by GST. In accordance with Indian Accounting Standard -18 on Revenue and Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013, GST, VAT, and Excise are not included in Gross Revenue from sale of products for applicable periods. In view of the aforesaid restructuring of indirect taxes, Gross Revenue from sale of products and excise duty for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2018 are not comparable with the previous

As a result of introduction of GST, Stock Transfer from Tea Estate in Durrung, Assam to Head Office in Kolkata during the quarter ended 31st March, 2018 was subjected to IGST and hence was considered as a Sale of Durrung Tea Estate of the Company and Purchase of the Head Office of the Company. As a whole, this simultaneous sale and purchase has no effect on the Financial Statements of the Company.

- 11) The Limited Review, as required under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 has been completed and the related Report forwarded to the Stock Exchanges. This Report does not have any impact on the above 'Results and Notes' for the Quarter and year ended 31st March, 2018 which needs to be explained.
- 12) The Company hereby decleares that the Auditors have issued modified opinion in their Audit Report for financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2018 in so far as it relates to non-provision of gratuity liabilities as per payment of Gratuity Act 1972 amounting to Rs. 245.61 lakhs for the year.
- 13) Figures for the quarter ended 31st March, 2018 represents the derived figures between the audited figures in respect of the current full financial year ended 31st March, 2018 and the published year-to-date reviewed figures upto 31st December, 2017, being the date of the end of the 3rd quarter of the current financial year.
- 14) The figures of previous periods for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2017 were audited by other firm of Chartered Accountants.
